Vaccines for Children Offered February 15th in Ogallala

Southwest Nebraska Public Health Department (SWNPHD) will be offering Vaccines for Children on Thursday, February 15th from 12:30 to 1:30 pm at Prairie View Elementary School, Superintendent's office. Anyone six months and older are invited to get their flu or other vaccinations. Walk-ins are welcome.

One of the many vaccinations available at the clinic is Poliomyelitis, better known as polio vaccine. The first dose is given at 2 months of age, second dose at 4 months and a third dose between ages 6 to 18 months.

According to WHO (World Health Organization): Polio is a highly infectious disease that can cause paralysis in a matter of hours. 1 in 200 infections leads to paralysis (usually in the legs) and between 5% to 10% of persons paralyzed die when breathing muscles become immobilized. Polio mainly affects children under 5 years of age. There is NO CURE for polio but vaccine can prevent transmission.

Polio cases have decreased by over 99% since 1988 as a result of the global effort to eradicate the disease. More than 16 million people have been saved from paralysis and 1.5 million childhood deaths have been prevented. In 1994, the WHO region of the Americas was certified polio-free.

Persons with no insurance or under-insured may qualify for the state funded vaccine. Call the office for qualifications at 345-4223. Both state funded and private vaccines are available at this clinic. Insurance billing and cash payment options are available to those who do not qualify for the free vaccine.
