

Comparing COVID-19 Cases 2020 to 2021

Southwest Nebraska Public Health Department (SWNPHD) has provided a comparison of COVID-19 case counts by month during 2020 and 2021 in the nine-county health district. Data for November and December 2021 is not yet available.

Late fall, especially November and December saw the highest case counts last year, and this year is seeing some of the same pattern. SWNPHD continues to recommend residents protect themselves against the ongoing spread of COVID-19 in southwest Nebraska, which includes avoiding crowded closed spaces, staying home when sick, and vaccination for eligible ages.



Even with the more contagious Delta variant, COVID-19 case rates have not spiked as high as last fall, thanks largely to the combined efforts of healthcare providers, pharmacies, public health, and many others who worked to provide COVID-19 vaccinations to more than 50% of southwest Nebraska's residents. SWNPHD owes a great deal of thanks to the many people who made this work possible, such as the staff at McCook's Mid Plains Community College who provided an ultracold freezer that was needed to store the Pfizer vaccine until SWNPHD could arrange to get one.



SWNPHD had 101 new cases of COVID-19 reported from October 26 to November 1, 2021, bringing the weekly average to 111 cases per week in the last 30 days. A breakdown by age includes: 0 to 19 – 24; 20 to 29 – 10; 30 to 39 – 6; 40 to 49 – 11; 50 to 59 – 10; 60 to 69 – 23; 70 to 79 – 12; 80 and over – 5. The total number of cases is 5,135.
